



## LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA [formerly Women's Non-Party Political Association

SRG 116 Series List

The Women's Non-Party Political Association was founded on 19 July, 1909 by a group of politically active women to work towards the "removal of all legal, economic and other inequalities between men and women".<sup>1</sup>

The "Political" was dropped from the title and in 1924 the name was changed to "The League of Women Voters of South Australia", with the sub-title "Women's Non-Party Association". This was to emphasize the link with the newly formed Australian Federation of Women Voters, founded in 1921 by Bessie Rischbieth of the Women's Service Guilds of Western Australia.

The S.A. League disbanded on 27 July, 1979 at the close of its 70th annual meeting. In that time the League had a number of standing sub-committees and temporary committees on such matters as juvenile courts, aboriginals, proportional representation, disarmament, the marriage act, the adoption of children bill and women on juries. It had branches at Blackwood and Henley Beach.

The Australian Federation of Women Voters had one only affiliate from each state, a condition of affiliation being that the words 'League of Women Voters' appear in the title or sub-title. The headquarters of the Federation were located in the State of the elected President and Vice-President generally for a term of 3 years. Conferences were held every three years, usually in the headquarters state, until 1972 when a decision was made to hold them every four years.

Some of the records in this group were deposited in the Archives by Mrs. Bessie Mountford who was associated with the League from about 1914<sup>2</sup> until its demise. In that time Mrs. Mountford filled several offices both with the League and with the Federation including League Vice President, Federal Vice President and Federal Honorary Treasurer. A distinction has been made in the series list between records relating to the League and records relating to the Federation. Adelaide was the headquarters State from 1967-69 and 1973-76.
